The Enriched Foreign Language Learning project is managed by the National Education Institute of the Republic of Slovenia (hereinafter referred to as 'the Institute') under the auspices of the Slovenian Ministry of Education, Science, Culture and Sport (formerly known as the Ministry of Education and Sport).

The project is executed by the Institute (i.e. planning, monitoring and evaluation) in conjunction with a network of primary and secondary schools who implement project activities at the school level. These network schools are supported by the Institute's professional advisory working group which consists of Institute staff and selected external advisors.

The schools who participate in the EFLL project are assigned a specific status, namely, home, partner or satellite. A school's status determines the level and amount of the above average quality of educational services, i.e. the added value which is achieved by the inclusion and work of a foreign teacher, as well as the school's responsibilities and tasks associated with it. In this way, the project both ensures equity of access to the added-value educational services and widens the range of participation options open to schools.

Home schools are responsible for the employment of the foreign teacher. Each home school is required to form a project team of at least 3 members (i.e. project team leader, foreign language coordinator and foreign teacher). The project team implements the project within the home school under the auspices of the Institute.

Partner schools include foreign teachers who are employed by home schools or the Institute. The foreign teacher is integrated within the partner school's curriculum for one or two days per week. A foreign language coordinator is responsible for the implementation of the project at the partner school level.

Home and partner schools are chosen to participate in the project after a public invitation and subsequent selection process. Selected schools must meet quality and suitability criteria.

Satellite schools offer their students shorter language enrichment programs developed and implemented by a selected group of foreign teachers in conjunction with the Institute. Schools interested in these programs apply directly to the Institute; approval is granted dependant on the availability of funds and the school's readiness to observe the conceptual and organisational parameters of the national project.

All project participants undergo intensive professional development training on a monthly basis which is organised and implemented by the Institute's professional advisory group.

The Enriched Foreign Language Learning project started on September 1, 2010 and will close on August 31, 2012.
